Ukrainian, Armenian & Georgian nationality laws do no recognize me as their own.

Even though I have lived in Canada, I am not eligible for protections.

After a denied asylum claim I was placed in final removal order at 13 years old, even when married to a U.S. citizen at age 24 years old my statelessness prevented me from adjusting status. I am now 36 years old.

Statelessness in the is both a legal and psychosocial issue, impacting every aspect of life, from access to rights and identity to mental health and community belonging




Lack of Identifictation

Inability to retain lawful employment Housing & food access barriers Inability to pursue higher education



Family Separation

Often permanently



Mental & Health Access Barriers

Inability to take care of ones body



Inadequate Legal Representations

Unable to adjust status yet unable to leave to live elsewhere



Repeated & Prolonged Incarceration

Under parole for decades



Largely unknown, misunderstood & undereported





Late Birth Registration Initiatives



Countries like **Bangladesh** and **Uganda** have introduced **mobile birth registration units** that travel to remote and underserved areas.



In **Kenya**, the government **waived late registration fees for children** born to marginalized communities.

Legal & Policy Reforms



Tunisia and Nepal reformed their nationality laws to allow women to pass their citizenship to their children.



Brazil and Philippines introduced dedicated procedures to determine statelessness.

Child-Friendly and Accessible Procedures



UNICEF and partners in South Africa introduced child-friendly legal clinics, where specially trained professionals guide children and families through the process of obtaining documentation



Thailand trained government officials on statelessness and children's rights, emphasizing fairness and sensitivity when interacting with affected families.

Impact Led Advocacy

Those directly impacted by statelessness are best positioned to be the first responders and advocates for their rights. Our lived expertise and deep understanding of these challenges are critical to identifying and implementing meaningful solutions. Their voices must not only be heard but actively included in crafting and sustaining effective responses to statelessness.
